Who are our other family members

By the end of the lesson, the learner should be able to outline obligations of children to other family members as an act of ibadah

Other family members and silat ur-rahim

"Other family members" includes siblings, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins. Islamic tradition places value on silat ur-rahim (maintaining family/kinship ties), understood as an act of ibadah (worship), not just social obligation.
