A TASTE OF LESSON 1

Identifying sites with poor soil

By the end of the lesson, the learner should be able to: a) identify signs of poor soil in the school or community; b) select a suitable site for soil improvement

Signs of poor soil

Poor soil often looks pale or grey, feels hard and compact, grows only weak or stunted plants, and may be found where rubbish has been dumped or where the same crop has been grown for a long time without rest. Good soil is usually dark, crumbly, and supports healthy plant growth.
